# Transportation

#### **Riding the Bus**

Please remind your child(ren) that for their safety they must follow expectations on the bus. Students must remain seated while the bus is in motion and keep the noise level to a minimum.

#### Car Pick Up

Dismissal time is at 3:30. Students may not arrive until 3:33 to 3:35. You may want to consider coming from 3:40 to 3:45 to avoid the congestion. For safety reasons, please form one line. Once your child is in your car, you may exit the line and leave. Please do not pull around another vehicle and attempt to get back in line. All students must be picked up by 3:50 or they will be escorted to the office.

#### Walkers

Students who walk to and from school should do so as safely as possible. Children should stay on the sidewalk at all times, cross the street at crosswalks after checking for cars, and never talk to strangers.

#### **Bike Riders**

Students who ride their bike to school should always wear a helmet and walk their bike across marked crosswalks.

For safety reasons please do not leave your student(s) at school unaccompanied before 8:30 AM. There is no supervision for your child(ren) before this time.

Drop off students in the East parking lot. For the safety of your child(ren) please do not let them out of the car on Fir Street and form one line only against the curb. Please do not park by the curb, but find a parking spot.
